A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the regulation of egg production, and
2 including effective date provisions.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 10A.104, subsection 12, Code 2011, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 12. Administer inspections and licensing of hotels, and
4 home food establishments, ~~and egg handlers.~~

5 Sec. 2. Section 196.1, subsection 3, Code 2011, is amended
6 to read as follows:

7 3. "*Department*" means the department of ~~inspections and~~
8 ~~appeals, as established in section 10A.102~~ agriculture and land
9 stewardship.

10 Sec. 3. ADMINISTRATIVE RULES — TRANSITION PROVISIONS.

11 1. a. Any rule, regulation, form, order, or directive
12 promulgated by the department of inspections and appeals as
13 required to administer and enforce the provisions of chapter
14 196 shall continue in full force and effect until amended,
15 repealed, or supplemented by affirmative action of the
16 department of agriculture and land stewardship.

17 b. Any license issued by the department of inspections and
18 appeals under chapter 196, and in effect on the effective date
19 of this Act, shall continue in full force and effect until
20 expiration or renewal.

21 2. An administrative hearing or court proceeding arising
22 out of an enforcement action under chapter 196 pending on the
23 effective date of this Act shall not be affected due to this
24 Act. Any cause of action or statute of limitation relating to
25 an action taken by the department of inspections and appeals
26 shall not be affected as a result of this Act and such cause
27 or statute of limitation shall apply to the department of
28 agriculture and land stewardship.

29 3. Any personnel in the state merit system of employment
30 who are mandatorily transferred due to the effect of this Act
31 shall be so transferred without any loss in salary, benefits,
32 or accrued years of service.

33 4. Any replacement of signs, logos, stationery, insignia,
34 uniforms, and related items that is made due to the effect of
35 this Act shall be done as part of the normal replacement cycle

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1 The bill takes effect July 1, 2012, except for the provision
2 requiring interagency cooperation which takes effect upon
3 enactment.
